

Covid-19 guidance for Places of Worship

Here are the key ways in which places of worship can maintain safety during the Covid-19 outbreak:

To support the NHS Test and Trace programme, worshippers should register when entering a place of worship. This will help any contact tracing work if it is needed.

To enable worshippers to keep a two-metre distance from each other, places of worship will have limited space and capacity.

Worshippers must bring their own items such as prayer mats and religious texts.

Worshippers should avoid public transport when travelling to and from a place of worship.

Worshippers must not attend if they have any symptoms of COVID-19.



Keep a minimum distance of 2 metres apart where possible



Wash hands frequently (for at least 20 seconds) or use a hand sanitizer with a minimum of 60% alcohol



Avoid touching your face, nose and eyes
