Wearing face coverings in church

The Church of England issued new guidance as follows, on Thursday 23 July:

The Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship encourages people to wear face coverings in places of worship and other enclosed public spaces. We strongly advise that face coverings should be worn by all those attending a place of worship where there may be other people present. Face coverings should only be removed to receive Holy Communion. Face coverings are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from coronavirus COVID-19 and they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing.

Parochial Church Council Meeting

St Margaret's held its first ever PCC meeting on zoom last Thursday. The meeting:

- Spent some time taking stock of where St Margaret's is in terms of its life and worship in the light of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Discussed the financial situation of both the Diocese and the parish, and also diocesan plans to reduce clergy numbers. There will be more about this in church and on zoom on Sunday 2 August.
- Agreed to purchase a new photocopier
