Scaffolding

The scaffolding around the outside of the church is in preparation for pigeon guano to be cleaned from the brickwork and windows of the church, and to apply optical gel dishes to the window ledges to deter pigeons gathering and nesting. The same work was carried out successfully last year at the west end of the church, since when we have not had a problem in that area. However, the pigeons migrated to other parts of the building. Hopefully the work this time will finally rid us of them!

Seating in church

The signs in the nave marking places where people can sit have now been removed, chairs returned to the Lady Chapel, and the tables and chairs put back in the children's corner. To make our church a safe worshipping area we ask that everyone continues to act responsibly, to be mindful of other people, and to keep social distance where possible. We recommend the wearing of face coverings and the use of sanitising hand gel.

Ilford Regeneration

First Reading: Joshua 24: 1-2, 14-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. And Joshua said to all the people, 'Now therefore revere the LORD, and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness; put away the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. Now if you are unwilling to serve the LORD, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served in the region beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD.' Then the people answered. 'Far be it from us that we should forsake the LORD to serve other gods; for it is the LORD our God who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, and who did those great signs in our sight. He protected us along all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; and the LORD drove out before us all the peoples, the Amorites who lived in the land. Therefore we also will serve the LORD. for he is our God.'

Second Reading: Ephesians 6: 10-20

Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to guench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.
