## Services for Holy Week and Easter

Places of worship have to strictly adhere to government Covid guidelines, in particular worshippers must wear face coverings; seating has to be at 2 metre distance; use hand sanitiser; no gatherings of groups of people inside the church. Congregational singing is still not permitted. Please do not arrive more than 15 minutes before the start of any service.

Covid restrictions in place mean that some of our usual pattern of services will have to be altered for this year.

Palm Sunday. 10.30am Blessing of Palms, Reading of the Passion Gospel and Eucharist

Our normal practice is to begin our worship on Palm Sunday in the church hall with the blessing of palms and reading of the Palm Sunday Gospel, before processing into church. None of that will be possible this year, and the whole service will take place in the church. You will be able to collect a palm cross when you arrive, and they will be blessed at the beginning of the Eucharist.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday in Holy Week. 7.30pm Night Prayer (Compline) on zoom. This is a short act of worship (about 10 minutes) for the end of the day, to reflect on the day and commend ourselves to God's safe keeping through the night. Joining details: Meeting ID 296 467 9306; Password 176040

**Maundy Thursday.** 7.30pm Eucharist of the Lord's Supper and Watch of Prayer This year the Eucharist will not include the washing of feet.

**Good Friday.** 2.00pm The Good Friday Liturgy

At the Veneration of the Cross, it will not be permitted to touch the cross.

Easter Day. 10.30am Easter Ceremonies and Festival Eucharist

#### **Bishop of Barking to retire**

Bishop Peter, our Area Bishop of Barking has announced his retirement. Over the past year Bishop Peter has also been Acting Diocesan Bishop of Chelmsford, following Bishop Stephen's move to become Archbishop of York last April. He will officially retire on 4 August, but as he has overdue study leave his public ministry will end before that date. He writes: "Now that Bishop Guli has been confirmed as



Bishop of Chelmsford, the time has come for me to announce my retirement as Bishop of Barking. It will be tough to leave an Area, a Diocese and so many people we have grown to love and appreciate, especially at such a demanding and exciting time for the Gospel. It was a real Godly surprise and privilege to be called to East London and Essex and it has been a great discipleship adventure.
